3/6 COMMANDING OFFICER'S POLICY STATEMENTS

Commander's Intent:

Our focus is warfighting. In order to be ready to answer the call when our nation is least ready we must be able to focus on our warfighting without distractions or detractions. All members of the Teufelhunden Battalion have an inherent right to an environment that is conducive to mission accomplishment, and provides the opportunity for all Marines and sailors to excel. I expect all members to TREAT OTHERS AS THEY WISH TO



BE TREATED and I will not tolerate any behavior, or act that detracts from a positive environment for all. Violations of the below policies will not be tolerated and violators are subject to disciplinary action.

Statement on Equal Opportunity: Equal Opportunity (EO) for all members of this command regardless of race, color, sexual orientation, religion, gender, or national origin is everyone's responsibility, regardless of rank or position. Anyone who witnesses an act of discrimination has a responsibility to address, correct, or report the inappropriate behavior immediately. Any member who believes they have been the subject of discrimination or inappropriate behavior should report the incident to the chain of command if they believe they are unable to resolve the problem themselves or the incident is criminal in nature. I charge everyone, as leaders, to take immediate and appropriate action when any form of discrimination is brought to your attention. MCO P5354.1D w/CH 1

Statement on Sexual Assault Prevention and Response: I will not tolerate sexual assault or harassment of any kind. If you have been sexually assaulted, if you have witnessed a sexual assault, or if you have information about a sexual assault, immediately notify your chain of command or uniformed victim advocate (UVA) - the UVAs are bound by law to maintain your confidentiality. Leaders who see or learn of acts of sexual assault or harassment must <u>ACT IMMEDIATELY</u> to stop the act and ensure the safety and protection of the victim(s). MCO 1752.5B

Statement on Hazing: No Marine or Sailor assigned to this battalion will engage in hazing or consent to acts of hazing being committed upon them. No leader will allow, excuse or overlook any incident of hazing. Consent to hazing is not a defense to violating this policy. Any violation, attempted violation or solicitation of another to violate this policy will subject those involved to disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Whether a victim, witness, or participant, all hands who suspect hazing has occurred will immediately report the suspected incident via their chain of command. MCO 1700.28B

Statement on Violence Prevention: We need to take action to stop violence on our watch and maintain a safe working environment. Do not ignore warning signs/indicators of potential violence or harassing, intimidating, violent, threatening or other disruptive behavior. If you observe or experience such behavior, report it to available resources whether its chain of command, duty personnel, law enforcement, etc. depending on the time sensitivities of the situation. Leaders who see or learn of acts of violence must <u>ACT IMMEDIATELY</u> to stop the act and ensure the safety and protection of the victim(s). MCO 5580.3

Statement on Suicide Prevention: Almost anything broken can be fixed, any wrong righted. Broken hearts will heal, bankruptcy can be overcome, drug/alcohol abuse can be treated. Dead cannot be undone. We all need help at times, know the Marine on your left and right - let them know you. Know the signs and indicators of suicide and be the Marine that intervened to save the life of a teammate who has lost the way. MCO 1720.2

Statement on Safety: Poor safety practices degrade the ability of our Marines and Sailors to effectively perform their duties, places lives at risk, and undermines the good order and discipline of our unit. We will manage risk and mitigate hazards through effective, efficient, and deliberate application of Risk Management (RM) to all activities, both on and off duty. RM is truly a thought process and a way of looking at a situation to mitigate potential negative outcomes. I charge all leaders to plan and execute training and operations in such a way as to mitigate risk and seek to prevent mishaps from eroding the readiness of our unit. MCO 5100.29B
